TEDDY PRESBERG AND INDUBIOUS: [FUNK THE WEST COAST TOUR](#)

PORTLAND, OREGON – Two of the west-coast’s funkier trios are teaming up this summer to bring their unique music all along the Pacific Coast. San Francisco based Indubious, and Portland based Teddy Presberg and The Red Note Revivalists, will kick off their “Funk The West Coast Tour” this August and tear through the coast in what promises to be one of the most funky and fun band combinations to share the road.

Indubious is genre-bending power trio, pumping a positive message and wielding impressive instrumental skill. Their new approach to funky reggae is already attracting fans in the San Francisco area and finds them playing to sold out venues across the bay. Their unique style caught the attention of five-time Grammy nominated producer, Cookie Marenco, who recently signed them to a long-term production deal.

Teddy Presberg is an improv-funk guitarist/composer performing with his trio, The Red Note Revivalists. Ropeadope Records recently picked up his debut album “Blueprint of Soul” and has scheduled a re-release for this fall. The album consists of songs written in a stream of consciousness, tracks done in one take, and unforgettable improvisational grooves. “I wanted to create something from the soul, a sound based on first impressions and inspired by the moment,” says Presberg. “I was going for something fresh, honest, and most of all, something funky that I could really dig into.”

Both bands have a passion for music and sharing their message. Spencer and Evan Burton of the band Indubious have had a very special bond since birth—they were both born with a gift. The brothers were born with the disease Cystic Fibrosis, a genetic disorder that is currently the most common life-shortening hereditary disease in the United States. Viewing this disease as a gift is a unique outlook on life that gives hope and rise to a whole new way of thinking and living for their faithful fans, who call themselves Indubians. “Live Indubiously” has become their motto, meaning living life without doubt and fear and a full respect for all things, good and bad.

Teddy Presberg also has a message to share. Via Threepin Records, Presberg donates a portion of his album proceeds to the Organic Farming Research Foundation in Santa Cruz, California. Through additional financial contributions to The Climate Trust, he also offsets the greenhouse gas emissions from his album productions. “It doesn’t matter what our profession is, we have a personal responsibility to reduce the negative impacts of our actions,” says Presberg. The “Funk the West Coast Tour” is a climate friendly tour, as both bands will offset the greenhouse gas emissions associated with their travel.

“There will be a lot of room for collaborating and jamming on the stage,” says Evan Burton of Indubious. “We are really excited to be splitting the bill with Teddy Presberg and his band, because like us, they share a common love for making positive music and letting it all hang loose.”
